Hugo grew up in Nazi Germany, where his family had lived for generations. His parents were forced to sell their business by decree, since they were Jewish. Hugo’s father was arrested in 1938, and then Hugo was forced out of public school by Nazi decree and into a Jewish school. Then, in 1940, he and his parents were deported to a Jewish concentration camp in France, without any idea where their final destination would be. They were later transported to Auschwitz, where his parents died.

In 1942, Schiller was one of eight children at Aspet chosen to be smuggled out of France. Sent

to the United States, Schiller lived with his paternal uncle and his family in New York, before being drafted into the army. After completing his service in the army infantry, he obtained his degree from the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York. After moving to Baltimore, he met his wife, Eleanor Cohan, and they married in 1956. In 1967, they moved to Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.
